


Statement on Traffic Calming Measures 09-06-18

The exhibition will continue to be available in the Library, Holland Sports Club and in the village hall foyer.

We have been asked many questions about the costs of the scheme currently being delivered and where the money is coming from.

The project is being fully funded by the County Council out of monies given by the developers of Barton Manor (the Bellways Estate) to mitigate traffic. This was as part of the planning conditions. The terms of the agreement mean that this money cannot be spent on anything else but traffic mitigation, but it also means that no public money is being spent on the works. The current project is delivering a gateway on each entrance to the village, modifications to the existing chicanes/squeezes on Station Road and Upper Main Street, the mini roundabout at the top of Efflinch Lane, some modifications to the road between Upper Main Street and past Little India and additional traffic calming measures on Bar Lane and Efflinch Lane. The estimated costs of these works is less than £250K.

The roundabout has been completed for now, but will be closed briefly to allow it to be resurfaced later this summer.

We have suggested to SCC that some temporary signage informing people where the road layout has changed would be a good idea.
